

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What the Sacraments Offer

- Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1131- "The Sacraments are <u>efficacious signs of grace</u>, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which <u>divine life is</u> <u>dispensed to us."</u>
- Baltimore Catechism "A sacrament is an <u>outward sign</u> instituted by Christ to give <u>grace</u>."

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Which of the Seven Sacraments are "Sacraments of Healing"? Cont'd

"But in a sense all the sacraments can be understood as sacraments of healing, since all are efficacious for the healing of fallen human nature." (Healy, Healing, 137)

Most, especially, the Eucharist is a source of strength and spiritual food.

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Which of the Seven Sacraments are "Sacraments of Healing"? Cont'd

- Anointing brings <u>spiritual</u> healing in times of <u>physical</u> illness
- Reconciliation heals our <u>brokenness</u> with God and the Church from our sins.

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Healing in the Old Testament

• Sirach 38:9 "My son, when you are ill, do not delay, but pray to God, for it is he who heals."



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Healing in the Old Testament

• Numbers 21:4-9 "From Mount Hor they set out by way of the Red Sea, to bypass the land of Edom, but the people's patience was worn out by the journey; so the people complained against God and Moses...So the LORD sent among the people seraph serpents, which bit the people so that many of the Israelites died.... So Moses prayed for the people, and the LORD said to Moses: Make a seraph and mount it on a pole, and everyone who has been bitten will look at it and recover. Accordingly Moses made a bronze serpent and mounted it on a pole, and whenever the serpent bit someone, the person looked at the bronze serpent and recovered."

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Healing in the New Testament

- Many stories of Jesus healing the sick
 - Jesus touched those who were prohibited from being touched – healing power of touch
 - Need for support from community
- Miracle cure vs. Faith changes how we look at suffering in sickness
 - Lepers
 - Physical healing
 - · Restored to community from isolation
 - People who have told me about a "sense of peace"

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Anointing of the Sick in the New Testament

- "He replied, "The man called Jesus <u>made clay</u> <u>and anointed my eyes</u> and told me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' So I went there and washed and was able to see" (John 9:11).
- "They drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them" (Mark 6:13)



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What does the word "Anointing" mean?



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Anointing of the Sick in the New Testament

James 5:13-15

"Is anyone among you suffering? He should pray. Is anyone in good spirits? He should sing praise. Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and <u>anoint [him] with oil</u> in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. <u>If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven</u>."

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What does the word "Anointing" mean?

- Refers to pouring oil on
- In terms of the Sacrament of Anointing, it symbolizes the reception of God's Grace

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What does the Catechism say about Anointing?

Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1293

"Anointing, in Biblical and other ancient symbolism, is rich in meaning: oil is a sign of abundance and joy; it cleanses (anointing before and after a bath) and limbers (the anointing of athletes and wrestlers); oil is a sign of healing, since it is soothing to bruises and wounds; and it makes radiant with beauty, health, and strength."

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Effects of the Anointing of the Sick cont'd

Lumen Gentium, 11

"By the sacred anointing of the sick and the prayer of the priests the whole Church <u>commends those who are ill to the suffering and glorified Lord</u> that he may raise them up and save them (cf. Jas. 5:14-16). And indeed she exhorts them to contribute to the good of the People of God by <u>freely uniting themselves to the passion and death of Christ.</u>" (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1521)



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Effects of the Anointing of the Sick

Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1520

"A particular gift of the Holy Spirit. The first grace of this sacrament is one of strengthening, peace and courage to overcome the difficulties that go with the condition of serious illness or the frailty of old age. This grace is a gift of the Holy Spirit, who renews trust and faith in God and strengthens against the temptations of the evil one, the temptation to discouragement and anguish in the face of death."

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Effects of the Anointing of the Sick cont'd

I have not seen an immediate physical healing when I anoint them.

I have been told they feel peace as they are anointed. There is spiritual healing. Which is more valuable?

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How does the Sacrament of Reconciliation offer healing?



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The Names Signify What It Means

(Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1423-1424)

- Confession Why is it necessary for us to confess our sins to be healed?
- Penance
- · Reconciliation
- Metanoia

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Effects of Reconciliation

Of course, we are reconciled with God (restored to a "state of grace"). What Else?

Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1468-1470
"Those who approach the sacrament of Penance obtain **pardon** from God's mercy for the offense committed against him, **and** are, at the same time, **reconciled with the Church** which they have wounded by their sins and by which by charity, by example and by prayer labors for their conversion." (Lumen Gentium, 10)





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Why confess to a human priest?

Question from a previous presentation

 "I struggle with the idea of going to confession. I don't struggle with the idea of being sorry for my sins and asking God for forgiveness. Why does the priest need to be involved?"

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Reconciliation in the Bible New Testament

- Matthew 9:1-8 Healing of the paralytic
 - Verse 6 "But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins."
 - Cf. Mark 2:1-12
- John 20:19-23
 - Verse 23 "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose you retain are retained." (cf. Matthew 18:18)

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People's Experience of Confession

- Stories of people getting yelled at in the Confessional
- My first time going when I came back





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Penance - Evidence of Our Contrition

(aka satisfaction, Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1459-1460)

Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1430 "Jesus' call to conversion and penance, like that of the prophets before him, does <u>not</u> aim <u>first</u> at <u>outward works</u>, "sackcloth and ashes," fasting and mortification, but at the <u>conversion of the heart, interior conversion</u>. Without this, such penances remain sterile and false; however, interior conversion <u>urges expression in visible signs</u>,

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gestures and works of penance."

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Act of Contrition

My God,

I am <u>sorry</u> for my sins with <u>all my heart</u>.

In <u>choosing</u> to do wrong
And failing to do good,
I have sinned against you
Whom I should love above all things
<u>I firmly intend</u>, with <u>your help</u>,
To do penance,

o do penance,

To sin no more,

And to avoid whatever leads me to sin.
Our Savior Jesus Christ
Suffered and died for us.
In his name, my God, have Mercy.
Amen.
