This is certainly true about the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, which were written <i>“that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name”</i> (John 20:31)</p>

Acts of the Apostles 4:12	<p><i>“Peter proclaimed that “there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved” (Acts 4:12)”</i></p>

Hebrews 4:15	<p><i>“For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin.”</i></p>
United States Catholic Catechism for Adults, 92	<p><i>“Who is responsible for the death of Jesus? Every one of us from the dawn of history to the end of time who in pride and disobedience has sinned is in some way responsible.”</i></p>

Luke 9:23	<i>"If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."</i>
Acts of the Apostles 1:6-12	The Story of the Ascension
John 14:26, 15:26, Acts 1:8	In these verses Jesus speaks of sending the Holy Spirit.
John 16:12-14	<i>"I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming. He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you."</i>
